Project Servator

Deployments are continuing throughout Colburn and Catterick Garrison. All officers in the Neighbourhood Policing Team at Catterick have now been trained as Disruptive Effects Officers.

Project Servator will deploy uniformed and plain clothed officers with specially trained officers together with other resources such as police dog units and Road Policing Group. Officers will be deployed in a variety of targeted locations and will be highly visible; however, specific locations, times, and details of resources will not be publicised in advance and are intended to be **unpredictable**.

The primary aim is to deter, detect and disrupt criminal activity and those with hostile intent. In addition officers will strive to reassure communities and encourage them to be vigilant and report all suspicious activity.
